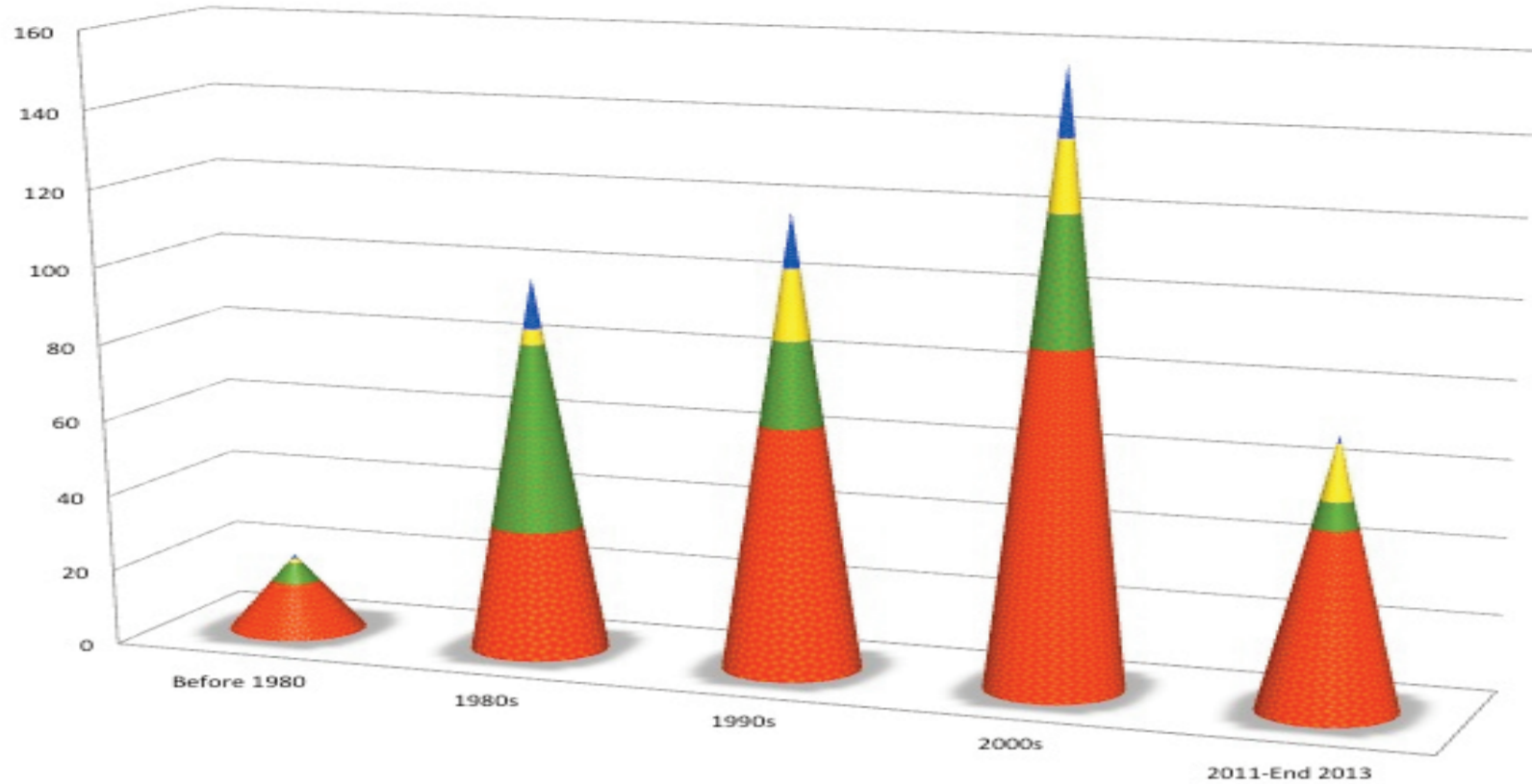

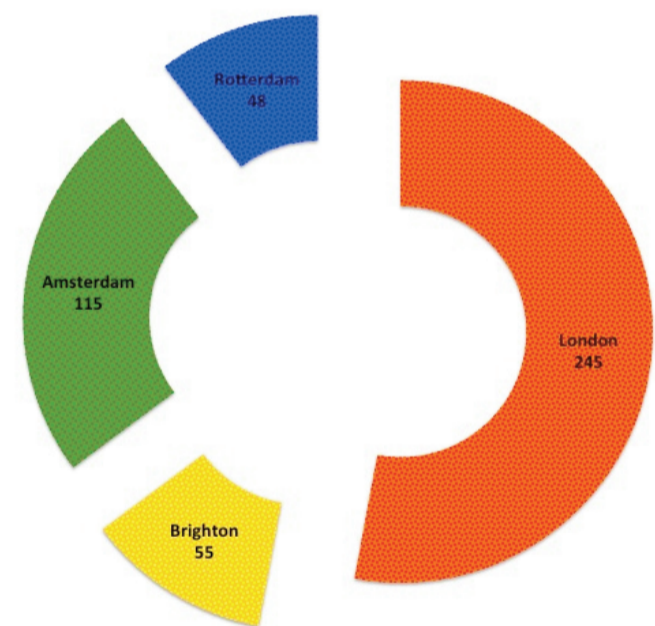
SOCIAL CENTRES BY TIME PERIOD



| | Before 1980 | 1980s | 1990s | 2000s | 2011-End 2013 |
|-----------|-------------|-------|-------|-------|---------------|
| Rotterdam | 1 | 13 | 14 | 18 | 2 |
| Brighton | 1 | 4 | 18 | 18 | 14 |
| Amsterdam | 5 | 48 | 22 | 33 | 7 |
| London | 13 | 33 | 64 | 88 | 47 |

- ◇ Huge diversity in terms of type of building occupied.
- ◇ Highest number of projects squatted in 2000s (157) but this may simply reflect the relative ease in acquiring knowledge about more recent projects.
- ◇ As a corollary of the above, impressive number of projects squatted in just 3 years, 2011 to end 2013 (70).

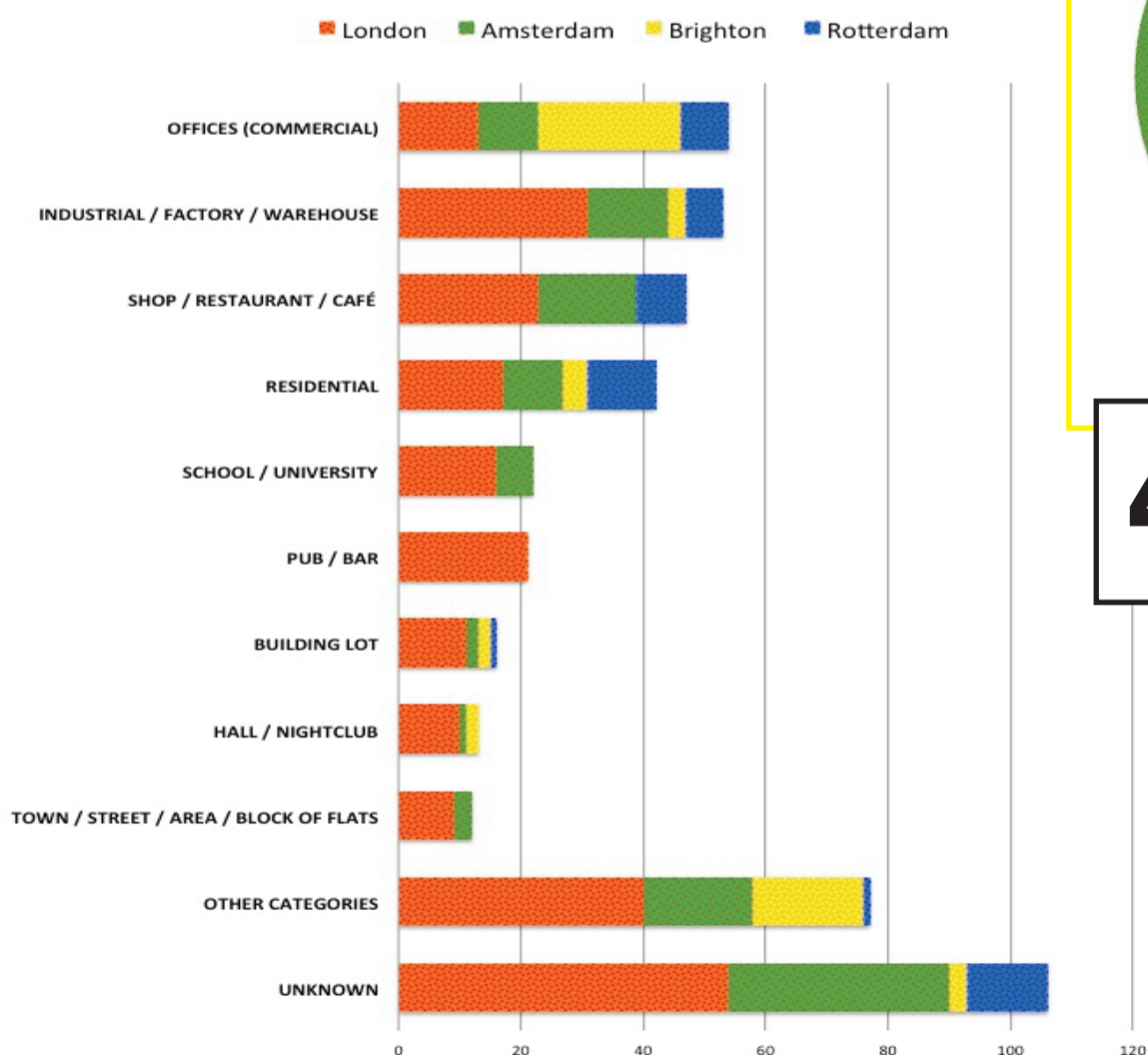
TOTAL NUMBER SOCIAL CENTRES

- ◇ What other categories would be useful to analyse? Lifespan of squats would be interesting but the number of unknowns makes analysis difficult.
- ◇ Number of projects legalised makes sense to analyse in the Dutch context but less so in the English one.
